REFLECTIONS...

It is that time of year again, when I feel the fall beckoning even though it is only July. The time when my eyes and ears begin to tune in more acutely to songs and articles and news stories, searching for possible High Holiday themes or sources of

inspiration. It's almost like tuning an instrument at an incremental pace, knowing where the pitch is meant to land, hearing the slow slide towards union, while knowing full well how many half and quarter steps stand between you and alignment.

I read voraciously during the summer, while the days are long and my anticipation is greatest. It is both comfort and escape, release and inspiration. Some of my reading is Jewish and academic, with a clear goal of finding sermon content. Other books are pure pleasure, reading for the sake of the beauty of a well-written sentence. I will frequently read a beautiful passage more than once, just in order to linger on it before I lose it to the next page.

This summer, the books that are calling to me are in one way or another about crossing boundaries, and finding common ground between seemingly different people; about healing and the importance of honest conversation; about faith despite clear evidence of the world falling apart. It would be so easy to spend my time reading articles about our devastatingly broken government and the impact of our fractured system on innocent people. I do spend time on that reading, but it inevitably leaves me in a state of despair and rage, which is not the ideal state in which to write hopeful or inspiring High Holiday sermons. And so I look to literature, and to wise elders, who remind me that the messages that speak to me most deeply when I need to be raised up from my own spiritual malaise are about hope, and love, and the urgent need for us to reach across towards one another at all costs.

I chose to go to the rabbinical school where I was ordained not only because it offered me a flexible schedule and distance learning, but even more importantly because of the values upon which the institution was founded. AJRCA is a pluralistic institution with teachers from all of the major denominations of Judaism, with the intention of gathering from the wisdom of each denomination, and creating leaders who are prepared to serve as agents of transformation in the Jewish world. I had teachers and classmates who were Orthodox, Conservative and Reform,

And so, thousands of years later and continents separated, we make our way as Jews in our own community at B'nai Tikvah. Generations later we carry on with our tradition of community and worship. For our secular calendar, August marks the end of the guieter days at CBT, and we will begin to fill the last of our lazy days of summer with rich programming at CBT. Join us for Shabbat in the Park, with Lisa Zeiler and Rabbi Chabon on August 2nd. We gather at 5:45pm with picnics and summer joy and welcome Shabbat in the great outdoors. Havdalah Yoga returns again on August 3rd and Nishma service returns on August 10th. Join us for Shir Joy on August 16th and save the date for a brand new program, FEAST. Food, music, and Shabbat! which led to rich and diverse conversations every single day. My seminary learning planted the seeds for the vision of my own rabbinate at CBT, which is born out of my belief that civil and loving dialogue will bring healing to the world.

My Judaism is one in which no movement is better than the other. My Judaism is born out of not just equality, but out of a yearning for the divided sides in each community to reach towards one another, for male and female, Republican and Democrat, immigrant and native-born people to realize that peace depends on us understanding that we cannot be at war with one another. I see God in the holy and the mundane and in everything in between. That is my Judaism and that will be the foundation of my rabbinate. That is the Torah I feel unfolding within me as I step onto this incredibly auspicious and holy path as your rabbi. I look forward to many meaningful conversations, to joyful and inspiring prayer and to deep spiritual growth with you all this year.





CBT's committee joined Midrasha to bring 28 Israeli teens plus four adults from the Mozenson High School in Hod Hasharon, Israel for eight days of adventures. The program included 43 American teens whose attendance varied day to day, 16 of whom hosted the Israelis. Together they went on daily trips to places like Google, Apple, Cal Berkeley, Six Flags, Stanford, Santa Cruz, a dance party and an amazing overnight retreat bonding together. The kids also cleaned the beach and visited seniors at Reutlinger. They are still in touch and plans are being made to visit Mosenson this winter.

CONTRA COSTA MIDRASHA

In early July I had the amazing experience of studying Torah and Talmud for 5 days at Pardes (an Englishlanguage Bet Sefer or House of Study) in Jerusalem. There was so much deep learning each day that I feel I have a year's worth to share. By far one of my favorite lessons was about "shalom." Commonly shalom translates to mean peace, hello and goodbye. The word shalom comes from the root - shin-lamed-mem, which become shlaymut or "wholeness." The educator, Tovah leah, went on to explain it as a "symphony of difference." I loved this idea of music being related to shalom. To achieve peace or wholeness, we have to include many voices into our symphony. How many times have I walked into a classroom of new students - each with their own ideas, ways of learning, histories, families, beliefs and more - with the goal of creating a unified classroom? How to do this? This idea of a "symphony of difference" really helps me conceptualize a way to bring unity into my teaching environments. If we have a shared goal or shared learning - each person is contributing their instrument, their voice into our classroom. With this vision in mind. we can create a classroom of wholeness, of shlaymut.

In June we held our Mifgash - our first ever 8-day adventure interweaving 28 Israeli teens with 43 American teens from our Contra Costa community, on daily bus rides around the Bay Area. We visited so many amazing spots - San Francisco, the Redwoods in the Santa Cruz Mountains, 6 Flags, Berkeley, Stanford and more. But what was truly amazing was watching these two different groups of people blend to build friendships, teach each other and become a true shared people. We were graced by the most amazing families hosting our Israeli visitors, by an amazing staff, and with beautiful weather. I will always remember our American boys teaching the Israelis how to play "American football" on Baker Beach, with the Golden Gate Bridge in the background; making s'mores around a campfire under a Redwood forest canopy, and enjoying the thrill of the rides at 6 flags. We're aiming to continue the project next year!
